- 3. In **John 6:5-6**, Jesus tests Philip by asking where they can buy bread. Why do you think Jesus did this?
- 4. How does Andrew's response in **John 6:8-9** differ from Philip's? What can we learn from this?
- 5. Compare these two banquets: Herod's from **Mark 6:14-26** and the Feeding of five thousand. Also reference Psalm 23
 - Discuss what you know about shame /honour culture and the response the people were expecting from Jesus.
- 6. What details in the story emphasize the miraculous nature of this event?
- 7. In the sermon, we discussed how Jesus had compassion on the crowd. When was a time you experienced unexpected compassion from someone? How did it affect you?
- 8. The disciples faced a seemingly impossible situation. How do you typically respond when faced with overwhelming challenges?

C. Great Provision

9. What is the need you are facing today?

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- 10. Jesus used a young boy's small lunch to feed thousands. How might God be calling you to offer your "small" resources for His purposes?
- 11. This week, identify a need in your community where you can show compassion like Jesus did. What specific action can you take to address this need?
- 12. Reflect on areas in your life where you might be limiting God's power. How can you step out in faith this week, trusting God to multiply your efforts?
