

- Your faithful giving has meant our finances have enabled us to continue to do all that God has asked us to do and support. Thank you!
- People continue to be drawn to Christ. We have seen conversions, baptisms, and people "just walking in" to find hope.
- ALPHA and Celebrate Recovery had carried on their work with many new challenges.


• We were able to have over 1000 people attend in person at Easter! Such an encouragement considering we only had an online audience last Easter.

However, as you know the challenges remain. We wish we could be able to fully open up, but presently AHS guidelines limit our attendance. We are committed to following those guidelines and I know this is not acceptable to many. As lead team (Jordan Polson and myself) and the Board of Elders, our decisions are guided by scripture, but two in particular: Romans 13:1-7 which says;

"Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves. For rulers hold no terror for those who do riaht. but for those who do wrona. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and you will be commended. For the one in authority is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for rulers do not bear the sword for no reason. They are God's servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer. Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience. This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. Give to everyone what you owe them: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honour, then honour."

And 1 Peter 2:13-14:

"Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by Him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right."



Praise the Lord we can still teach from the Bible and preach/share the good news about Jesus!

At CrossRoads, we have been called by the Lord, **"to give everyone in Central Alberta an opportunity to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and be following Him together, impact the world with compassion and hope."**

For us, that is the main thing! We don't want to get pulled off it, distracted by rabbit trails or 'bunker down' and forget our neighbours. Our mission is to reach Central Alberta for Christ not 'instruct the government' how to do their job, or be driven by the latest cause. We want to be known by what we are for not what we are against.

Perhaps this will always be the greatest challenge.

Prayerfully pondering what God might be up to in our world I have come to three conclusions:

i. It is a time of pruning the church.

Pruning is not pleasant but painful. Branches are cut off and trimmed back, but the end result is more fruit.

ii. It is a time where God is preparing the world to hear/receive the gospel.

With the loss of hope and a world trapped in despair and fear, the ground is being prepared for an unprecedented outpouring of the Holy Spirit, which I believe, will sweep many into God's kingdom. iii. It is a time for the church (you and me) to get ready.

Love the Lord. Love your neighbour and do everything to be found

confident and unashamed when God comes with power.

Let me mention three exciting upcoming events:

1. We are planning, Lord willing and weather permitting, another outdoor service on July

25 that will include baptisms. The details need to be worked out, but we are looking forward with anticipation to a great Sunday.

We are beyond excited that Nik and Ruth Ripken are planning to be with us the weekend of September 17-19... Nik wrote: *The Insanity* of God and *The Insanity* of Obedience.

2. We are beyond excited that Nik and Ruth Ripken are planning to be with us the weekend of September 17-19. Nik and Ruth have spent many years in Somalia and other countries and have much first-hand experience with the persecuted church or as Ron Pearce would call them, "the persevering church."

Nik wrote: *The Insanity of God* and *The Insanity of Obedience.*

Don't miss them – this will be a life changing weekend we will never forget! In preparation, pick up a copy of *The Insanity of Sacrifice*. It is a 90 day devotional Nik wrote packed full of challenges and incredible stories of God at work in our world.

> 3. Starting this fall, we will be 'officially kicking off' our 10 week Foundations of Faith course lead by Pastor Denise. It is a course designed to help you understand, experience and put into practice some of the core beliefs of Christianity.

EXECUTIVE PASTOR Jordan Polson

STAFFING

The entire staff have shown such tenacity as we adapt with restriction changes, doing meetings over Zoom and with a lot less connection with so many of us working from home. The staff care so deeply for the church and for the mission we've been given. They have been stretched as to how they shepherd and connect with our church family and community. I have so appreciated their heart and dedication to CrossRoads and want you to know what a great job they are doing.

Like so many other people and businesses, our staff was also affected by COVID. In December we had 9 staff with COVID and we were forced to close down the building and services for a two week period. We were successful in preventing further spread and our staff have all recovered. Thank you for your care and prayers.

We've seen many changes to staff over this past year. In September we started to re-call people that had been laid off earlier in the year as we needed to meet the current level of support required. We are not planning to go back to the same number of staff that we were at prior to COVID. We left some positions un-hired in the current budget plan. Prior to COVID our Full Time Equivalents (FTE) were at 42 and currently we are at 35.5 FTE with a budget that provides room for 38.5 FTE.

Josh Sissons joined us on staff last year in the role of Associate Pastor

of Student Ministries. We are thrilled to have Josh. his wife Rebeca and as of January, little Ezra joined our CrossRoads family. Pastors Jordan and Julie Cavanaugh will be making some significant changes with Jordan moving into the role of Pastor of Community Life and Julie looking to pursue what God has next for her. They have served our K-6 Ministry and families with extreme excellence and I would ask you to remember them in your prayers as they start this next chapter. They will complete their time in Children's Ministry at the end of June. We have commenced our search for the next Pastor of K-6 and we ask that you agree with us in prayer as we look for the right person to fill this role. Our K-6 Ministry staff have done an outstanding job during COVID and have made many adjustments throughout the year when required. Our families have been greatly blessed by their leadership over the K-6 Ministry.

FINANCES

I want to thank you for your continued giving. Your faithfulness and regular giving have been such an encouragement to the Finance Committee, the staff, and the Church Board. We recognize that these times have been extra tough on some; with job loss, salary reductions and added expenses. Our givings are currently down but it would also be important that you know that our expenses are also down. We anticipate a balanced year-end, and we thank God for that. Please refer to the proposed budget (on page 22) for our year-end projections.

BUILDING

With the building being less used this past year, we have been able to do a lot of much needed maintenance and repairs. We were able to upgrade over 75% of our lights to LED and the facility team has been busy painting and doing a lot of deep cleaning. The building does get used in the ebb and flow of the restrictions which is constantly changing but we by no means use it to the degree we were, prior to COVID. Phase 4B remains delayed and we will continue to keep you updated on the status.

FINAL THOUGHTS

On behalf of Kathleen and myself, I'd like to thank you for your continued love and support. Over this past year Psalm 32:7 & 8 have been my foundation and support and it has sustained me through the ups and downs. We both had COVID in December and during that time we felt God's care and your prayers. We cherish our CrossRoads family and thank God that we have the opportunity to serve alongside you.

As we have entered year 2 of COVID I am pleased to bring you this encouraging update. While we don't know what lies ahead, we do know that God is the one who controls it all and I trust you will be encouraged and hopeful for the year ahead.

PASTORS of K-6 MINISTRIES Julie & Jordan Cavanaugh

EMBRACING CHANGE AND PRESSING FORWARD

The 2020/21 ministry year has held great changes for everyone, and this can certainly be said of K-6 Ministries. Last spring as a ministry we moved Sunday School online to keep our families and kids engaged with fun and faith-growing Sunday School videos. Through their creativity and resourcefulness, and some great editing from Joan Johnson, K-6 online videos have been reaching not only families from CrossRoads, but all across Red Deer and Central Alberta. After months of being online and meeting outside for pop-up Sunday



school to reach families while we were in lockdown, we were able to get back to in person gatherings in September and at the same time offer our video sunday school to families who were not ready to return.

In returning, our on-site ministry model had to shift as we sought to work with the realities of the pandemic. With this a new Small Groups Kids Ministry model was created and implemented. The success of this has been astounding. Each week our Serve Team comes excited and energized to spend their Sunday with 5-6 kids praying, playing games, and learning Scripture together. Kids are leaving knowing new and old friends better, learning their classroom teachers, and excited to share with parents.



As we saw our Sunday ministry growing and solidifying, we saw the need to reach out beyond our walls to families who were still unable to join us. This led to us to try a few creative ideas. Over the last year we as staff and core volunteers made videos to families with prayer for them and their current realities. We launched a few activities and community engagement events that were a blessing not only to families and kids. but also to our staff. We ran an advent box drop off with a calendar of at home activities for the whole month of advent, but also a prayer phone call from any of our delivering staff members to homes across Red Deer and Central Alberta. As a ministry team we saw many moments of care as we delivered these packages and reconnected with families, while a few of the team stayed to pray for those who came to pick up their boxes.

In February we ran our first annual Family Day Fun Day Gameshow via Zoom which was an absolute blast to celebrate the day with families and create some fun. We were also able to host our first online Faith @ Home event where we facilitated a conversation on how to navigate technology. We felt hesitant about how the Zoom platform would work for an event like this, but the broad attendance and engagement from our families, has us thinking we could keep using this platform!

As we move on in the 2021 year, change continues to happen. Pastor Jordan will be moving to become our Pastor of Community Life and Pastor Julie will be helping K-6 Ministries transition into June, when she will step down from her role. In the meantime a search is being made for a new Pastor of K-6 Families.

Joshua Schweer has also now been hired permanently to lead, train, and care for our K-6 Serve Team and Joan will continue to give oversight to our curriculum. As Jordan and Julie transition, we are in the midst of continuing to move the ministry forward. We are knee-deep in filming training and vision videos for the ministry and our plans for summer ministry are in full swing. With the most recent shut down, we don't want to pause what Jesus is doing amongst us.

As a ministry we have asked our Serve Team to join us on Sundays to pray together and write encouragement cards to our kids and families. We are also committed to keep offering relevant and fun video Sunday school! Right now in K-4 we are spending time around Paul's teaching in First Corinthians to run the race with commitment as if we want to win the prize of representing Christ well and sharing His kingdom message. In Philippians 3 he bolsters this by saying how we should press on towards this goal, forgetting what is behind and striving for what lies ahead.

This year has had many challenges, but we leave them behind us as we press on to what God has been faithful in and will continue to be as we pursue Him in loving His kids, families, and our community here in Red Deer and Central Alberta.

PASTOR of STUDENT MINISTRIES Rob Mudde

I've re-written this report three times as it is hard to sum up what student ministry has been like this year. I've landed with random bits of info of the year and it seems to fit:

- 32 Youth leaders returned to kick off the year!
- 4 gallons of hand sanitizer purchased bulk.
- 12 boxes of masks.
- 45 students allowed per night which we doubled with upstairs and down stairs acting as separate meeting areas.
- 16 construction fences were rented to separate the youth center into four quadrants so we could meet the next restriction.
- 8 more weeks of shut down.
- 6 more Zoom small group nights (for those youth who could still handle Zoom).
- 3 Youth services per Sunday.
- 4 Instagram live nights where youth leaders lead the youth night as a virtual team.
- 300 of our student ministry followers clicked to watch our virtual youth nights a week. (some times more but never less)
- 2 more youth services added. One on Wednesday one on Thursday.
- 50 students came out on average a week divided between the 5 youth services.

100 -the times we said to each other "don't worry the restrictions are going to lift really soon."

THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

We kept pushing. The commitment of the youth leaders, the students, and their parents was baffling to me. With all the change and the process everyone had to go through in order to just meet as a group of students with their leaders was huge. And yet every week everyone took care of their set of hurdles required to make a youth night happen.

God showed up. We hear a lot of negative when it comes to Covid these days from youth. What they wish was different and what could have been better, but there is an exception. If you ask students how their walk with God was this past year, the response is almost always "oh it was way better". Most explain a series of events that corralled them, so to speak, into a place where they just had to be closer or just wanted to be closer to Jesus. One student told me this week. "I think the only thing I have been committed to this year is Jesus. There was nothing else to be committed to because it all just kept changing." So cool! I believe

God gained a lot of territory in the hearts of our youth this year.

There was suffering. Ya, I know I have that in the highlight section, but almost every good thing that happens in someone's life comes out of suffering. Paul says in Romans 5:3-5... "we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us."

I look forward to seeing the fruits like character, endurance, and hope!

PRAYER REQUEST

I have one that sits pretty heavy on my heart. Pray that God would bring us back together again. I don't mean that we don't have to social distance, I mean our hearts towards each other. This has been a year of opposing messages, beliefs, ways of understanding the Bible and of following Jesus. Lines got drawn, boundaries set. MINISTRY LEAD PASTOR Shawn Hubert

Hebrews 10:24-25 says, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

This fall and into 2021, 'Covid 2.0' showed the importance of that verse in the life of our church community. As 40+ fall groups began mostly meeting in-person, many expressed thankfulness to finally share life face-to-face. Some continued to meet online because of member's compromised health, work schedules, or physical location. There were several seniors' groups that began meeting online for the first time, allowing the blessing of technology to help them maintain relationships, teaching time and prayer. Adaptability and flexibility for all groups were key as sudden government restrictions quickly stopped the meeting of groups in-person, and then reinstated inperson groups a short while later. The perseverance and patience to continue doing life together and build each other up in Christ no matter what the circumstances, was truly evident in this season. The winter sermon series saw around a dozen groups being created or expanded to allow people to experience community. Several groups continued for more than the initial "Unfazed" sermon series. In spite of the unpredictability, God was still in control and His spirit was still moving in the lives of His people as they found new ways to be His hands and feet in the church, with their neighbours, and in Central Alberta.

Alpha this fall resumed in-person meeting of approximately 20 people, Winter Alpha ran fully online with 19 members, and Spring Alpha is inperson with 25 participants. Celebrate Recovery has run as a hybrid group, with capped attendance in-person, alongside online their online group. This set-up allowed the group to continue uninterrupted and allowed for an easy switch-over to a totally online format when restrictions deemed it necessary.

Throughout this year we have seen Zoom meetings be both a blessing and also frustrating for our group participants and our group facilitators.

We are very grateful to those facilitators that took extra efforts to ensure genuine connection was able to happy despite the hurdles of the last year. This year was also a challenge from a staffing perspective. We had a complete year without a Community Life Pastor, since Pastor Jason left early Spring of 2020. Kimberly has been assisting community life throughout the year while Amanda was on maternity leave. Kimberly has done a great job learning the computer systems and support our group facilitators extremely well. Pastor Denise has also continued to be an extra support to the community life team and provided practical and spiritual guidance.

Pastor Denise has given leadership to the baptism process over this year and helped those taking this important step of faith. Denise has developed and taught the Foundations course this spring. Helping those new in faith to build a strong theological foundation for their faith journey. We are looking forward to many more people attending the Foundations course over the next year.

We are extremely grateful to have Pastor Jordan Cavanaugh joining Community Life this month (June, 2021). He will give us leadership and be a great pastor shepherd for our group leadership in the years to come. Jordan has served well in our families ministries departments over many years, and will bring with him a heart for building authentic relationships throughout the entire community of CrossRoads.

As we anticipate coming out of COVID restrictions in the near future, we know that helping people reconnect into community at CrossRoads is a priority as a church and a real felt need among those who attend. This year, we are looking for many people to step into group facilitation and group participation.



PASTOR of SPIRITUAL FORMATION Denise Snyder

In the world of Spiritual Formation, I jumped back in after finishing my maternity leave at the end of September. This area of ministry continues to grow and evolve in really exciting ways as we seek to grow as disciples of Jesus. Here are some of our highlights from the past year!

- We were able to finally run our first Rooted Women's Bible Conference in October after postponing it due to COVID restrictions in March 2020. We welcomed more than 100 women both in person and online as we spent two days digging deep into the Scriptures and how to practically apply it to our lives. This was a wonderful event and we hope to do it again!
- We had another meaningful Advent season through our booklet, teaching times and Sunday services as we looked forward to the arrival of our coming King!

 Lent was impactful this year as Pastor Dallas and I hosted a weekly event on Facebook Live. We spent time walking through God's covenants in the Bible, which led us to the New Covenant that Jesus institutes at the Last Supper. We were joined each week by CrossRoads' staff, and loved discussing Scripture, worshipping and praying together.

- Our new Foundations course is up and running! This course is meant to help Christians better understand the beliefs and practices of Christianity. This spring we ran the course both in-person and online, and have spent time exploring Bible, prayer, community, suffering, worship, etc. We have loved learning, experiencing and practicing the faith together.
- Our Palm Sunday baptism was an amazing time to celebrate with those who have decided to follow Jesus and declare it publicly. I was able to do multiple baptism interviews over Zoom and get to know the stories of those being baptized.

At less than 1% Christian, Pakistan is one of the least-reached nations of the world. Our multi-year support of the Bible Correspondence School enables the good news of Jesus to be shared in places where no established churches exist and it isn't safe to have a visible church gathering.

In the past two years, since the school started, over 100 people have responded to the good news about Jesus, and over 80 of these individuals have been baptized! Ten house churches have also begun in this time, resourced by the team we support in Pakistan.

GLOBAL DISCIPLES:

Global is about reaching the leastreached, 'til the whole world knows' because a third of our world is still waiting for an opportunity to hear about Jesus, His love and salvation. There was a LEAD Directors Training held in February where participants were highly impacted and another training for Mission Directors is running this May.

With both outreach teams to Greece from 2020 cancelled, we are grateful to have been able to continue our support of Antonis, a local church planter who is doing amazing things! He and his team have been working hard to renovate property donated to them for a community centre & café called Moses Coffee. They aim to reach out to the wounded people in the city and share the gospel and love of Christ with them. Revenues from the café are directed towards Sanida (Mercy) Ministries. Sanida will be a home set up to rescue women facing abortion or abuse. These young women are given a safe place to live and heal as well as an opportunity to work in the café as baristas.



Antonis reports, "God is good! We have managed to have Bible studies in homes, small groups and new people are coming and that is good, God is good!"

BRIDGES OF LOVE:

The Lebanese people have been through so much with the bomb blast earlier this year, massive economic deterioration and the pandemic. Through it all the staff of Bridges of Love have been providing love, support and encouragement to some of the most vulnerable. After the bomb blast we were also able to send relief funds which helped the staff assist with medicines and supplies needed in the city.

REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP - New Canadians

In 2016 we initiated sponsorship of two Syrian families in Lebanon; one arrived in 2018 and we are still awaiting the second. Finally, there is progress with their file; If you would like to be part of the team that helps welcome

UNCHANGING IN CHANGING TIMES

There is comfort and peace in knowing that God is unchanging. He is perfect in all ways and does not need to adapt or adjust to whatever is going on in the world. As He has been He forever will be – in His Character, His purpose and His promises. He remains the same even in these changing and uncertain times. Stability and a solid foundation are so important in these times.

Our local partner agencies and organizations and the people who work in them have faced challenges and change over this past year. However, God has been faithful. The provision of much needed services, programs and giving of Hope to those they come in contact with and serve has continued.

Hope Mission, The Pregnancy Care Centre and Aerie Maternity Home, The Outreach Centre and Dragonfly Centre for children affected by trauma continue to provide the same outstretched and welcoming hand to those in Central Alberta who are in need. Things may look a bit different on the surface but the underlying values and message remain the same.

All of our agency partners and the schools that we have relationship with report increased need within their client population. Whether that be for emotional support and counsel due to relationship distress and the trauma in its wake, the stresses and decision making around an unexpected pregnancy for a Mother and other family members, the need for mentoring and positive role models in young people's lives. All of these situations are magnified and become more complex within a pandemic. Isolation, financial hardship and food insecurity are being experienced as well and can increase and cause further strain in households and relationships. It is a cycle that goes round and round. These are difficult and challenging days for families, for parents and for children.

Just as God is unchanging, so is His word to us, which tells us that we are to care for the orphan and widow, with those in need, to share with others what we have, to love others as Christ has loved us. We see that care and sharing in the organizations that we support and who allow us to impact our city.

HOPE MISSION

At Hope Mission in Red Deer, their focus continues to be caring for vulnerable children and families. They continue to reach out to kids through Zoom, offering online conversation and Bible lessons, art and craft classes and connecting through delivering meals and lunches to kids at school and their homes.

Most importantly, Hope Mission is allowing children to develop healthy relationships caring adults who share God's love with them.

This summer they will be offering outdoor Day Clubs for small groups of kids in a physically distanced environment as well as continuing to provide nutrition for families in need in Red Deer.

HOPE GROUPS & PRAYER MINISTRIES

"The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing." Psalm 23:1 (NIV).

I am thankful for how Jesus leads us in a journey of learning to trust Him more through whatever obstacles we face. I am humbly grateful for how Jesus has led and provided for Hope Ministries over this past year.

It is a new season for us as a team and it has been a privilege for me to get to know Pastor Ken and Pam better as we serve together as a Hope Ministries staff team and to have Pastor Shawn's supervision and counsel.

As we look back on the past year, I want to start by highlighting Hope Groups. Hope Groups are support group environments that delve into some of the tough things or deep valleys of life that people may walk through. As support groups, they are deemed "essential" in this season with AHS guidelines and have continued to meet in person. We are thankful.

GRIEFSHARE

GriefShare is one such group and it is designed for people who are grieving the loss of a loved one. Derek and Lynne have co-facilitated two 13-week seasons of this group since mid-October. They nurtured an environment where it is safe to share as they led the group through conversations in relation to the Christ-centred video content each week. I had the privilege of sitting in on the group a couple of times. It felt like holy ground as people shared their stories, their questions, and heartache. There were tears, laughter, and people simply being real as they listened to one another and prayed for one another.

I appreciate how Derek oversees this ministry. I appreciate his heart for Jesus, his heart for people, and his sense of humour. The plan is for this group to resume again in late summer or early fall with Derek and Hettie cofacilitating the group.

DIVORCE CARE

DivorceCare is also a 13-week group that began meeting in mid-January and wrapped up its first session at the end of April. Back in the summer and fall, we were praying for God to raise up facilitators for this Hope Group. The Lord had put this ministry on Corey's heart and he was excited to see it begin here at CrossRoads. Then the Lord led Lori-Anne to join the team. Finally, He added Art and the four of us talked, praved, and planned for the start of the group. These conversations and times of prayer were invaluable in preparing for the group to begin early in the new vear. I had the chance to observe each of these leaders share from their own stories of walking through the pain of divorce and come alongside of others in Jesus' name. Corey and Lori-Anne co-facilitated an environment where people felt safe to share vulnerably about where they were at. The Lord has also raised up Ross and LeeAnne as group facilitators who are now hosting the second session of DivorceCare that began in early May.

Lori-Anne shares about her experience with this vital ministry:

"On December 25, 2020, my children's and my world was forever altered. Completely shocked and devastated by the proclamation I frantically <u>searched</u> for support and guidance.

By the grace of God, I happened upon the DivorceCare program at CrossRoads. The timing was absolutely perfect. God's timing. The thirteen week program came at the most vulnerable, terrifying time in my life. With no family in the province and the dreaded Covid restrictions I could not have felt more overwhelmed and isolated. DivorceCare allowed me the opportunity to face difficult emotions. The videos and workbooks provided coping mechanisms and strategies to help overcome obstacles and future challenges. Truthfully, it was the moral support, prayers and encouragement of the individuals who led and attended the meetings that ultimately made the course. One little angel God planted just for me: this person was such a beautiful source of wisdom, compassion and God's love for me. I will forever be grateful. Quick texts, emails and even one little comment would lighten my load and raise my spirits. In my opinion. the DivorceCare program facilitates the opportunity to share a horrendous journey with others who are currently walking or have walked the long, difficult path. Suddenly, the burden becomes lighter."

TOOLS FOR A LIVING HOPE

This past fall, we also began working toward a Hope Group in relation to mental health needs, specifically in the area of anxiety. Pastor Shawn introduced me to Don Albers and I have learned much from Don as we prepared together for this group. Don helped to facilitate wall-mapping conversations as we brainstormed ideas and then worked towards the goal of launching the group at the beginning of April: The Soul Outfitter Series: Mental Health Hope Group - Tools for a Living Hope. Don took the lead on forming the content. The group's Scripture focus was on the book of Ephesians. We explored practical tools related to awareness of what we're thinking and feeling and bringing all of that to Jesus to hear His words of truth. Listening prayer exercises and reflecting on songs of worship rounded out the key

parts of the group's content. I was impacted by hearing members of the group share their own stories and praying together. The group has run for 8 weeks in April and May and it will wrap up on June 1st. Lord willing, we hope to have this group run again in the fall.

Don shares from his experiences from this past Soul Outfitter Session:

"I (Don) enjoyed working with Dave as we ventured together. I was blessed by the courage of each participant as they reached out to engage. Seeking help when facing a mental health challenge is difficult. Our emotions, our thoughts, our relationships and even our physical body are affected when our mental health is in crisis. Every person suffering from a mental health condition has a valuable and often painful story of factors affecting their mental health. Some face difficult life experiences that have overwhelmed them. Others experience biological factors affecting their brain chemistry. Others have been through trauma or abuse. An example of finding new hope was shared by one participant: She experienced a complete shift in her perspective as she explored with Jesus the Parable of the fig tree that was not bearing fruit. Peace came over her as she understood Jesus' willingness to protect her and help her. Luke 13:6-9."

The Mental Health Hope group aims to be one positive factor offering hope to people who want to engage their faith in God as they seek help. The reality is complex for all involved. We ask for your prayers as we discover the best ways to minister Jesus' love, hope and power to people experiencing mental health needs.

PRAYER TEAM

I appreciate Pastor Ken's leadership of the prayer team. Since this past fall, it has been a privilege for me to step into this role of giving pastoral leadership to the prayer team. There is tremendous commitment and dedication by the prayer team as they pray for people and remember the prayer requests that are shared with us online through the CrossRoads website.



This dedication is evident on the prayer team chat via the WhatsApp messaging platform. Here, my teammate Pam shares prayer requests that come to us largely via submitting online through the website. From there, prayer team members respond in the group chat that they will be praying for that request. Sometimes, it is a shorter note and other times it is a longer prayer. Please know that these godly men and women are praying in every season behind the scenes.

Again, with AHS updates and guidelines, it has been an interesting year in the area of being able to pray for people in-person. I am thankful for the creativity this past fall in setting aside the NW corner of the foyer for prayer team members to meet and pray with people after the services. Since then, following the services, prayer team has been in the Sanctuary praying for people.

Dianne Buchholz serves with prayer team and here is a story that she shared from this past year:

"I prayed for a man as he passed me at the front of the church. He could not lift his arm because his shoulder was wrecked. As I casually prayed for Jesus to meet him and restore him, he was being hit by some kind of power. Not knowing what to do, I asked him if he could lift his arm to which he replied "Lady, I told you that ..." as he lifted his arm high!!! How can anyone say that Jesus doesn't love us? Don't tell me He can't do whatever it is you need today! O, I want to see more of

A WINDOW OF OPPORTUNITY

Worship ministry, like many other ministries at CrossRoads, has experienced a year of new and unexpected opportunities. "Opportunities?" You ask. "Don't you mean a year of closures and restrictions, of 'unprecedented' and 'new normal'?" Yes, that too. But we've also seen some new windows of opportunity opening up. Maria said it well in The Sound of Music: "When the Lord closes a door. somewhere He opens a window". Like the story of Joseph (see Genesis 37-50), God can pack difficult circumstances with so much good purpose (Genesis 50:20)!

After months of online services, the two outdoor gatherings in August breathed new life into our worship teams and church family. With inperson services starting up again, despite limited attendance rules, things were looking up. Though 15% occupancy is 85% less than we'd love to see, it was a window - one that lasted until very recently and one that we have been so grateful for. Our online experience was improved and expanded, with hundreds of devices signing in every Sunday, each representing a family participating from home. What a privilege to continue to lead our CrossRoads family in worship of our glorious, worthy Father!

In the fall, the Lord gave us a theme for the year ahead: being known by God and by each other, and honing our gifts and skills as worshippers. Our weekly Thursday gatherings in the fall focused on personal musical goal-setting and on finding tools to pursue growth.

And we saw windows of opportunity all over the place! We had teams serving on Sundays, at Celebrate Recovery, with junior and senior high students and young adults. We pooled some money and blessed several hurting families and individuals in our city. We served at Embraced, a city-wide worship event, and at an Alpha retreat. We also hosted a Burn, an extended worship and prayer time focused on healing.

Leadership at CrossRoads saw an open window during the Christmas season and initiated the Merry Christmas Red Deer video project - a message of hope and joy to our city. But as three teams prepared and recorded music for the project, there was a COVID outbreak among staff and our worship crew. Unfortunately, Merry Christmas Red Deer wasn't completed, however the support for those affected by COVID was plentiful and compassionate, and everyone recovered well. Just in time for six Christmas Eve services full of joy and hope after all! God is so good!

As the calendar changed to 2021, we felt led to focus on the 'being known' part of our fall vision and to invest in community. So during the Psalm 23 series, two Zoom worship groups were created. They met virtually each week for rich discussion and prayer time. Most Thursdays in the new year were spent in worship and prayer rather than music practice. Together, these three nights every week contributed to spiritual growth and maturity that prepared our crew well to serve in all of our various technical and musical avenues.

Usually, one of the brightest spots on the worship calendar is Thursday



Night Live (TNL), an event celebrating original music written by members of our team. This year, that door was firmly closed. But God opened the window and we have embarked on a ten-song TNL recording project! Stay tuned for more on that and also on some hymn re-writes our crew is pursuing! More closures creating openings.

We had the opportunity to participate in weekly Lent conversations, each including a song recorded by our crew. What a cool bonus to go deeper with our CrossRoads family in preparation for Holy Week! Nine of our worship family also committed to fasting and praying each week of Lent, meditating on Philippians 2:1-18. It was a challenging but rewarding time of sweeping sin out the corners of our hearts, learning about humility and intercession, and seeing God pour out fire on sacrifice.

Like other CrossRoads ministries, our Serves have opinions about the pandemic that cover all points of the

spectrum. But one thing we're united on is following Jesus as best we can together. Our technicians and musicians have stepped up, some serving multiple times in a month to bring the message of the gospel to Central Alberta. God has provided for all our needs, according to His glorious riches in Jesus (Philippians 4:19)! Huge thanks to our devoted worship family for their servant hearts in this season!

Though it feels like many doors have closed this year, Pastor Dan has reminded us that the most important door is still open, the one God has opened that cannot be shut (Revelation 3:8), giving us access to the Father through the complete work of Jesus on the cross. For this, we will never stop worshipping, never fail to sing! "Heaven is open! So let Your kingdom come!"

So many cool positives came through this last year as God worked in our hearts in the midst of the uncertainty.

We were able to slow down and dive deep into why we do things; take the time to check our biases and bents, strip the processes bare and answer the question in front of all of us, "How do I live out our vision as a church and serve the people of Central Alberta?" Through this process,

> we accomplished a number of tangible items including implementing new event management and work order management software and protocols. However, most importantly, we allowed ourselves to take time to get to know each other better,

understand how to support each other, and took time to pray for each other.

This past October, Hannah took the lead in organizing a day of continuous worship and prayer from 10am to 10pm in the Chapel at CrossRoads to ask Jesus for physical, mental or emotional healing. It was an impactful time of meeting with Jesus and bringing others to meet with Him. Matt and Hannah make themselves available to intentionally pray for people's inner healing. This is something that the Lord has clearly placed on their hearts and I am excited to see what He has planned in this way. Please enjoy this story from Matt:

"One Sunday in church Matt felt prompted by the Holy Spirit to share a word of encouragement with a man (we'll call him 'Allan') sitting ahead of us. As Matt shared a picture the Lord had given him for this man, you could see the tears trickling down his eyes and his countenance changed. Something shifted in the spiritual and you could feel that Jesus was touching his heart.

Allan had been believing lies for many years and as the song goes,

"Oh, just one word, You calm the storm that surrounds me. Just one word, the darkness has to retreat. Oh, just one touch, I feel the presence of heaven. Just one touch, my eyes were opened to see. My heart can't help but believe." (*There's Nothing that Our God Can't Do* by Passion)

Allan's wife caught me in the lobby and said, "You have no idea, but I've been on my knees praying for him for several years. A few Sundays ago, he no longer had a desire to come to church, he had lost his faith, our marriage was barely hanging on."

Later they shared:

"We are completely shaken. Allan hasn't been overcome and overwhelmed by the Holy Spirit like this in years. He is soaking in the word of God. He said he doesn't know how to use words to even describe what it was like for him to receive this word from God but that he felt things physically coming out of him as Matt spoke and prayed over him. Allen and his wife could not describe just how desperately this word was needed. Allan walked into church, a man who had no hope, his marriage was falling apart, his relationships were broken and he was surrounded by darkness. He left church smiling, holding hands with his wife with mended relationships and a heart full of peace.Allan's wife had been journal writing, prayers and believing and asking that by Palm Sunday the Lord would work a miracle in him and in their marriage - "We cried tears of joy today. God showed up"."

I love this story because it gives us a glimpse into the power of the prayer -God heard the many prayers of Allan's wife and nudged someone else in the body of Believers to share the exact thing he needed to hear. The Lord is ready to speak through us to strengthen, encourage and comfort others when they need it. What a beautiful picture of how the body of Christ works!

As we look to the year ahead with Prayer Ministries, I am asking Jesus to help us be in step with Him. I am excited to see what He has planned as we pray with people on Sunday's, both in person and online. I am excited to see what He has planned for groups that gather to pray, like the group that Olga hosts on Tuesday evenings. Thank you for remembering Hope Ministries in prayer!






